PROJECT SUCCESS & ACHIEVEMENTS

2021 Project Summary

Amhara, Ethiopia – Established 60 women's health groups providing local communities access to family planning and sexual and reproductive health services.

Goro Woreda, Ethiopia – Provided 525 pregnant women with personalised health calendars to increase uptake of antenatal, postnatal and child immunisation appointments. Trained 50 Community Health Volunteers to use the innovation to support women during key points of pregnancy, delivery, and infancy.

Mathare and Kibera, Kenya – Supported a participatory research study to understand male engagement in child health and nutrition in urban informal settlements.

Zanzibar, Tanzania – Supported and trained the Ministry of Health and INGO partners to design and implement network of community health groups for maternal and newborn health.

Faridpur, Bangladesh – Established **6** community health groups to test whether they can help address the rates of preventable childhood injuries, such as drowning, electrocution and burns.

Ntchisi District, Malawi – Supported partners to adapt community health groups to improve adolescent sexual and reproductive health.

Small Projects – Equipped over 200 teenage girls in Oyam, Uganda to make reusable sanitary towels, enabling them to attend school. Produced e-learning materials used by 21 organisations in 9 countries including: Cambodia, Somalia, Malawi, Nigeria, Sierra Leone, Tanzania, Uganda, UK and USA.

What We're Doing Next

Our **strategy for 2022-2024** sets out a roadmap for continuing Women and Children First's life-changing work in some of most rural and remote communities.

Position

We have proven the potential of community health groups to improve maternal and newborn health (the PLA-MNH approach).

We will collaborate with national governments and their partners to **position PLA-MNH for scale-up** in countries, where it can save thousands of lives every year.

Prepare

We have developed **new innovations** with local communities to empower them to take action on their health challenges.

We will **prepare these innovations for scale up** through rigorous testing and evaluation, including:

Alternative models of PLA tackling wider health challenges e.g. adolescent SRHR and childhood injuries

A personalised health appointment reminder system for women and children in remote rural areas (Re-cal-I)

Toys enhanced with health messaging to support stimulating play and responsive caregiving (Play++)

Power Up

We will secure sufficient funding to upskill our team and improve our systems in readiness to work at scale.

"I'm Protecting My Family's Health"

Chaltu, 24, lives in the Goro Woreda, Ethiopia. She suffered the distress of losing her first child. She says, "I lost my baby boy immediately after birth at home. I bled a lot." She had no trained medical support on hand to help her.

Chaltu continues, "Through participating in the women's health group I started to know about complications that may arise during and following my next pregnancy.

"I managed to attend four antenatal care visits and gave birth to my baby boy at the health centre without any problems and with the assistance of the midwife. I also received postnatal care service by the midwives. I am very happy for the services that I have received.

"The women's health group helped me to know about personal hygiene, housing and sanitation, and maternal and newborn health problems.

"Previously I had little understanding about these issues, and I did not consider it important. Now I've got a clear understanding about it. I am practicing what I have gained.

"I believe it is very important to continue these meetings, so that I can better protect my health and the heath of my family."

WHO WE ARE, WHAT WE DO

Our Vision and Mission

We want a world where all women, children and young people can survive and thrive.

Too often, they face problems that kill them, harm them or hold them back. Dangers like severe complications in pregnancy and childbirth, deadly diseases and a severe lack of support for their sexual and reproductive health needs.

Local communities have the answers. But too often they are told what to do, treated as the problem or ignored.

Not by us. We empower local communities to take action to overcome the health challenges they face.

Our flagship innovation, the community-led Participatory Learning and Action for Maternal and Newborn Health group approach (PLA-MNH) is approved by the World Health Organization.

PLA groups can reduce maternal and newborn mortality by 49% and 33% respectively.

At scale, PLA could save the lives of 350,000 mothers and newborns per year.

We are also currently **testing new models of PLA** and **incubating two innovations** (personalised health appointment calendars - Re-cal-I - and children's toys adapted with important health messaging - Play++) which at scale could contribute to saving the lives of over 2.5 million more women, children and young people per year and enabling millions more to thrive.
